

# Proposition 84 Statewide Park Program – Round One

## Patton Street Pocket Park

This project will create the new Patton Street Pocket Park in the City of Los Angeles through acquisition and development of .4 acres, and construction of a new picnic area with sunshade, playground, community garden, walkways, and landscaping.

Through community based planning meetings, youth, seniors, and families selected these features. Additional design ideas from residents to be included in the project are:


- Outdoor exercise equipment with bilingual instructional panels, nutrition information, heart rate zone, body mass index calculator and other health advice, grassy area for tai-chi and yoga with benches.
- Rotate community garden and park layout 90 degrees so the garden is next to the adjacent neighbors.
- Park will be gated and locked at night, rubberized surfacing to be around playground equipment, safety lighting.
- For park beautification, residents will design and install painted and broken tile mosaics inlaid into walkways and retaining walls. Plant shade trees and native landscaping and add artistic entry gates.
- 14 Los Angeles Conservation Corps youth will participate in construction of the park.

The project will include these sustainable techniques:

- Use efficient irrigation system with evapotranspiration and soil moisture sensors.
- Grading and drainage plan will keep all water on site.
- Site amenities will include recycled content.
- Use native, drought tolerant plants.
- Use solar or LED lighting, use locally sourced materials, low/no VOC paints.

The park will be open daily from 7 AM through dusk. No fees will be charged for general park use with exception to community garden plot fees of \$40 per year.









